




John 16 is a difficult passage of scripture. Think about it for a second. The disciples who have spent so much time with Jesus and pledged their lives to follow Him are now hearing that Jesus is about to leave them. They are confused, saddened and anxious about what all this will mean for them. In verse 33, Jesus says, "I have told you these things so that in me you might have peace." (NIV) How can we have peace when the reality seems to be so different? That's what we're facing now. We're facing a reality that doesn't seem to match the peace that God promised us through His son Jesus Christ. The beauty is that we don't stop reading at the end of that clause in verse 33. The complete verse says, "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." (NIV) The power of the verse is in the fact that Jesus claims He has already overcome the world. This is before Jesus was betrayed. This is before He was arrested. This is before He was falsely accused. This is before He was beaten. This is before He was nailed to an old rugged cross. Before the crucifixion Jesus claims the victory over the trouble of the world. He says I have overcome the world. That's what we must do now. We must overcome the world by choosing peace over panic and faith over fear. And it is with God's peace and our faith that we too soon will be able to claim that we have overcome COVID-19, social unrest, political turmoil and anything else the enemy might try to throw our way. We are more than conquerors through Him that loves us!



Tips for Freshmen entering college




"Faith Over Fear"

Wash Your Hands!



Cleanliness is next to Godliness (Acts 9:32-10:23)

Since Mid-March, we have been told, asked, admonished, recommended, advised and some parents have even threatened us to "Wash Your Hands." As never before, maintaining clean hands is essential to life---like "Essential Church" is to our Christian development.


Nothing replaces warm water, soap and scrubbing thoroughly for 20 seconds or more when we think of good hand cleaning. By this time, most people have this mastered. What we might be missing is drying our hands COMPLETELY. Some experts believe using a disposable paper towel is the preferred way to remove the germs from hands. Think of the water, soap and scrubbing as the way to loosen contaminates (dirt and germs). Rinsing removes more of the unwanted agents. Reusing a hand towel is not ideal, especially during the flu season and the Coronavirus Pandemic. If it's not feasible to use paper towels, at least use a separate hand towel per person and change towels out frequently.

BEWARE! Hand sanitizers are a 21st century convenience and money making product. Sanitizers cannot replace hand washing, although it might be better than nothing. The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has released important information warning consumers that sanitizers are not all the same. The number one contaminant is *Methyl known as wood alcohol and 1-propyl. Look for sanitizers that are at least* **60% Ethyl or Isopropyl alcohol** because non-alcohol sanitizers that contain benzalkonium chloride are not shown to be effective to kill Covid-19. Companies have been exposed for producing substandard sanitizers to "grease their palms" at the health risk to us. Please visit the link below for potentially dangerous hand sanitizers.

I'm passing forward some good wisdom and advice that was shared with me...If and when you use hand sanitizers, consider using name brands like GermX and Purell that have been around for years or NOT AT ALL!



Cleaning is the removal of visible soil (e.g., organic and inorganic material) from objects and surfaces and normally is accomplished manually or mechanically using water with detergents or enzymatic products. Thorough cleaning is essential before high-level disinfection and sterilization.

Disinfection describes a process that eliminates many or all pathogenic microorganisms, except bacterial spores, on inanimate objects spores, on inanimate objects.

Sterilization describes a process that destroys or eliminates all forms of microbial life and is carried out in health-care facilities by physical or chemical methods. Steam under pressure, dry heat, EtO gas, hydrogen peroxide gas plasma, and liquid chemicals are the principal sterilizing agents used in health-care facilities.

The basic premise of the rule is to explain how to divide after tax income and how to appropriately spend it using 50% on needs, 30% on wants and 20% to savings as a model. However, biblical principles teach us to set aside 10% for our tithes therefore; we would recommend factoring this percentage into the rule.

What Is the 50/30/20 Budget Rule?

- The rule states that you should spend up to 50% of your after-tax income on needs and obligations that you must-have or must-do.
- The remaining half should be split up between 30% to things you might want and 20% savings and debt repayment.
- The rule is a template that is intended to help individuals manage their money and save for emergencies and retirement.
- Americans have significantly high debt levels, totaling \$14.3 trillion as of March 2020.

50%: Needs

Needs are those bills that you absolutely must pay and are the things necessary for survival. These include rent or <u>mortgage</u> payments, car payments, groceries, insurance, health care, <u>minimum debt payment</u>, and utilities. These are your "must-haves." The "needs" category does not include items that are extras, such as HBO, Netflix, Starbucks, and dining out.

Half of your after-tax income should be all that you need to cover your needs and obligations. If you are spending more than that on your needs, you will have to either cut down on wants or try to downsize your lifestyle, perhaps to a smaller home or more modest car. Maybe carpooling or taking public transportation to work is a solution, or cooking at home more often.

30%: Wants

Wants are all the things you spend money on that are not absolutely essential. This includes dinner and movies out, that new handbag, tickets to sporting events, vacations, the latest electronic gadget, and ultra-high-speed Internet. Anything in the "wants" bucket is optional if you boil it down. You can work out at home instead of going to the gym, cook instead of eating out, or watch sports on TV instead of getting tickets to the game.

This category also includes those upgrade decisions you make, such as choosing a costlier steak instead of a less expensive hamburger, buying a Mercedes instead of a more economical Honda, or choosing between watching television using an antenna for free or spending money to watch cable TV. Basically, wants are all those little extras you spend money on that make life more enjoyable and entertaining.

20%: Savings

Finally, try to allocate 20% of your net income to savings and investments. This includes adding money to an emergency fund in a bank savings account, making <u>IRA contributions</u> to a <u>mutual fund</u> account, and investing in the stock market. You should have at least three months of emergency savings on hand in case you lose your job or an unforeseen event occurs. After that, focus on retirement and meeting other financial goals down the road.

If emergency funds are ever used, the first allocation of additional income should be to replenish the emergency fund account. Savings can also include debt <u>repayment</u>. While <u>minimum payments</u> are part of the "needs" category, any extra payments reduce the principal and future interest owed, so they are savings.

Importance of Savings

Americans are notoriously bad at saving, and the nation has extremely high levels of debt. As of March 2020, Americans have \$14.3 trillion in total debt, which includes \$438 billion in credit card debt. The personal savings rate in 2019 was 7.6%, down from 11% in 1960.

The 50-30-20 rule is intended to help individuals manage their after-tax income, primarily to have funds on hand for emergencies and savings for <u>retirement</u>. Every household should prioritize creating an emergency fund in case of job losses, unexpected medical expenses, or any other unforeseen monetary cost. If an emergency fund is used, then a household should focus on replenishing it.

Saving for retirement is also a critical step as individuals are living longer. Calculating how much you will need for retirement and working towards that goal, beginning at a young age will ensure a comfortable retirement.

The Bottom Line

Saving is difficult, and life often throws unexpected expenses at us. By following the 50-30-20 rule, individuals have a plan with how they should manage their after-tax income. If they find that their expenditures on wants are more than 30%, they can find ways to reduce those expenses that will help direct funds to more important areas such as emergency money and retirement.

Life should be enjoyed, and it is not recommended to live like a Spartan, but having a plan and sticking to it will allow you to cover your expenses, save for retirement, all at the same time doing the activities that make you happy.

How have you made an impact on an organization or a community? "Currently, I am serving as a Crisis Counselor for the Crisis Text Line. This global not-for-profit organization provides free mental health texting services through confidential crisis intervention. Many of our texters are often suicidal and we talk with them to bring them back to a safe place or seek help for them. Our conversations can be anywhere from 30 minutes to an hour. I am so blessed to be a part of this effort on behalf of Verizon."

Merritt joined WakeMed in 1974 as a Clinical Laboratory Assistant. At the time, Raleigh Campus was much smaller than it is today, and Pathology operated out of a modular trailer. Today much of that work is automated, and the team spends more time evaluating what is reported to make sure it makes sense with a patient's profile and thinking about how it will impact them.

Merritt offers this advice to new WakeMed employees: Never stop learning! "Don't be satisfied with where you are. My career has been fabulous – and it's because I never stopped learning. Never say to yourself, 'I can't do that' because you can! This organization is ever growing, we are never the same place, and you have to keep growing too," she says.

True to form, Merritt is spending her last two days at WakeMed training the future generation of WakeMed's laboratory team! When she officially retires on September 2, she is looking forward to enjoying time with her husband and traveling as soon as it is safe to do so. And, after 30+ years starting work at 5:30 am, she is looking forward to sleeping in!

Glenda Murray is a SBC TRAILBLAZER.

Glenda is Raleigh's 1st African American Police Officer. Although her tenure at the Police Department was short lived, she most loved being a part of the community. She spoke briefly on her favorite part of the job, training! Later, she became the 1st African American female correction officer to go out on the yard at Central Prison. Women were often assigned to tower patrol, but she was afforded the opportunity to patrol inmates while they exercised and socialized outside. Thereafter, she'd go on to work in the Mental Health Unit. Part of her responsibility was to help feed them. While working on the third shift, she would review files of the mentally ill inmates and learn more about them. Most cases were sad but eye opening. Eventually, she pursued her real passion. She became a teacher with the Wake County Public School System. She loved teaching and mentioned it was embedded in her bones even at a young age, when she taught young children Sunday School lessons at the tender age of 12. "When teaching is in you, you just know". Glenda worked for WCPSS as an English teacher for 30 years and was honored with being the 1st Black "Teacher of The Year" at Apex High School when the majority of the school population was 99% Caucasian. She had other careers along the way, owner of a daycare, Job Corp, Department of Labor, Department of Correction: Probation & Parole at the Women's Prison and the US Marine Corp Officer Candidate School to name a few. Here's another fun fact, Ms. Glenda was a founder of SBC Newsletter.

Glenda stated that she has met some awesome people along the way and feels blessed and thankful for every opportunity that God has afforded her.
