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# Matthew 28:16-20

<sup>16</sup> Then the eleven disciples went away into Galilee, into a mountain where Jesus had appointed them. <sup>17</sup> And when they saw him, they worshipped him: but some doubted. <sup>18</sup> And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. <sup>19</sup> Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: <sup>20</sup> Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. ## LESSON #3

It's one of the simplest words in the language GO. The word go is defined in English as –move from one place to another; travel; proceed or advance. This word is a controversial word in the Great Commission. Despite how people parse the words, go is an \_\_\_\_\_
