MAT-MAKERS



Audio-Visual Ministry

The Audio/Video Media ministry would like to share how the blessings of The Lord continue to move within this branch of Springfield Baptist Church. Under the leadership of the late Reverend Daniel Sanders and our Board of Deacons, the A/V Media ministry was granted the approval to upgrade our A/V system. Our current system has been in place since our existing sanctuary was built in 2002. Although a lot has changed in the industry concerning audio and video equipment, our Lord has blessed us to keep things going as seamless as possible, with a few hiccups here and there 😊. Our current equipment has well surpassed the manufacturer service life and has reached a point that the dealers no longer worked on the equipment and our only resource at times was "eBay" ("But God")! There has been times that it was by God's grace and favor that cameras that were no longer functioning would suddenly start working!

In 2016 we were given the go ahead with Phase 1 of planning, purchasing, and installation of the new video cameras, screens and associated equipment. Through seeking what was the most cost effective solution and negotiations with various vendors we were able to not only install 5 HD quality cameras with screens, but also install lights for the pulpit area. We also upgraded our Computer Graphics equipment with use of a new Apple computer and digital broadcast mixer. We pray these tools will greatly enhance our broadcast and streaming experience for all.

Please feel free to stop by and see what God is doing within the AV Media ministry and speak with our team. There are many aspects to this ministry. Ministry SPOTLIGHT

SBC Prison Ministry

A recent interview with Bro. Wade Patrick provided insight to the work of the SBC Prison Ministry. Hopefully it will enlighten and continue to encourage us toward the call of the Great Commission.

- **What is the "primary goal" for the Prison Ministry?** The "primary goal" for this ministry is to help those that are incarcerated to be an overcomer through Jesus Christ AND give hope through fellowship, praise and worship by teaching and preaching God's word. Our ultimate desire is to let them know that no matter where we are, God still has a plan and purpose for our lives.
- **Why does Springfield do this?** Springfield does this because we believe that ministry work outside of the church is very important. It is a great opportunity to give hope to anyone, regardless of their situation, and no matter where they are.
- **Who can join this ministry?** Anyone committed to the Gospel, willing to be led by the Holy Spirit to be a servant of the Lord and bring hope to those that are incarcerated.
- **Who would fit well with this ministry's mission/goals?** It would be those who are compassionate and have a desire and a zeal to carry out God's word through the preaching and teaching with a willing commitment to serve.
- **What is the process for being approved to visit?** The process consist of attending a class about the requirements and rules of the prison system. Next you would have to have a background check to confirm eligibility; after which (if eligible) you will receive an identification card.
- **When would interested persons need to be available?** They would have to be available on our committed day to minister at the prison, which is the 2nd Thursday of every month from 6:30pm - 7:30pm. A 1-hour weekly commitment.
- **Can you explain why commitment is super important for this ministry?** Our commitment shows our desire to make a difference in someone's life. Showing also that serving others is a part of leading a Christian life and a genuine commitment to Christ.
- **How do you keep in touch with the inmates?** We do not keep in touch with the inmates because the prison system has a policy which limits any information sharing between the volunteers and the inmates.
- **Are there sponsorship opportunities for those in the congregation that are not able to join the ministry, but want to support the ministry or the inmates?** No, because again there is a strict policy within the prison system regarding such interaction.
- **Are there any programs at SBC that can support them once they are released?** Not at this time.

As a result of a discussion that occurred in the 18 - 25 young adult class during the 2018 Vacation Bible School here is a summary of what the Bible says to Christians regarding the word "fool".

What is in Your Heart? What is a fool according to the scriptures? If you use the word, what is your heart intent when calling a person a fool?

According to Matthew 5:21-22 (KJV), "Ye have heard that it was said by them of old time, Thou shalt not kill; and whosoever shall kill shall be in danger of the judgment: 22) But I say unto you, That whosoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment: and whosoever shall say to his brother, Raca, shall be in danger of the council; but whosoever shall say, Thou fool, shall be in danger of hell fire."

Wow! In danger of hell fire is serious. But in context, what are these verses saying? One thing conveyed is the progression of anger. Beginning with being angry without a cause; developing into calling one Raca (an Aramaic derogatory expression that is synonymous with empty-headed, stupid or inferiority); and then culminating with the term fool. If we allow *anger* to settle and grow, we can be in danger of resentment that leads to hatred which is NOT of God. The Bible is clear that our Christian command even in anger is to "sin not." The term fool is associated with spiteful language that originates from *hatred*. Matthew Henry's commentary regarding the use of fool states that malicious slanders and censures are poison that kills secretly and slowly. Let us ask ourselves when using any word, how will this glorify God?

Proverbs contain many characteristics of a fool; including but not limited to one who denies Christ, and those who reject wise council to name a few. When we use the word fool, are we using the word that accurately describes the person? The KJV dictionary definition states, "Fool is often used for a wicked or depraved person; one who acts contrary to sound wisdom in his moral deportment; one who follows his own inclinations, who prefers trifling and temporary pleasures to the service of God and eternal happiness." If we agree that wisdom and fool are contradicting terms, do we know that in a person's error they are wrongly using knowledge? Can we assume another person's knowledge base is our own? Not all have been as privileged as us to know the things of God; and none of us know it all. Is calling one a fool our duty or our desire? One might say, the Bible uses the word in reference to others. Romans 1:22 states, "Professing to be wise, they became fools." Are we without fault to be able to label a person with such a strong word? God uses and refers to the unwise as a fool, but God knows the heart, mind, motive and final destination of all.

In the terms of a child, we have been advised to be careful what you hear, see, touch, taste and SAY. The tongue is dangerous and who can train/control it? It is the flesh nature to say what comes to our mind and what is in our heart.

In all that has been said, we have seen that there is truth that fools exist; but as Christians, we might consider the use, context and our heart's intent if calling a person a fool.

Swim Bike Run

Congratulations!!! to SBC's own Kandaree Dawkins who recently completed her first Rex Wellness Sprint Triathlon. According to an interview with the N&O, Kandaree had to go out and buy a bike when she decided to sign up for a triathlon. She hadn't ridden one in 35 years.

Ms. Dawkins, 60, gathered with about 350 people in the pre-dawn darkness to prepare for the Rex Wellness Sprint Triathlon, her first timed race. She and about nine other participants are patients of Dr. Lindsey Sharp, a weight-loss surgeon who a few years ago began encouraging patients to participate in the swim-bike-run contests after trying a triathlon himself.

Kandaree hadn't ridden a bicycle in more than three decades before she started training in March. After her weight-loss surgery in 2013, she had mostly been walking and weight training.

She got Sharp's email about triathlons last year but wasn't sure she wanted to try. "I had doubt that I could do it," said Dawkins, a Clayton resident who works in banking. "He kept encouraging me, so I told him I would do it this year."

Although Dawkins competed with an injured knee she finished the cycling segment with a smile on her face. "It was better than I thought it was going to be," she said. "The hills were a tad bit challenging, but I made it."

Through God's Grace, Springfield continues to abide and grow in every aspect that feed the needs of its people. Though not yet completed, our upcoming Multi-Purpose Center is proving to be a catapult for providing the continued resources required for the holistic well-being of the Springfield Family. As a result of the ongoing Multi-Purpose Center volunteer meetings, a group of eighteen (18) gardening enthusiasts has been formed. These volunteers will take the lead in breaking ground for Springfield's first modern day ½ acre garden, which is currently being referred to as the 'Growing In Grace' Community Garden. This glorious inaugural garden will be located on the Springfield Complex just east of the Multi-Purpose Center.

In their first organizational meeting, held on March 3, 2018, the group of volunteers hosted an "In the Garden Chat" with Minister Curtis Joyner. In this gathering, Minister Joyner, an experienced farmer, explained and answered questions concerning the fundamentals of establishing a successful garden, including soil testing, tilting the soil, organic fertilizer, proper plants for each season, irrigation and the likes. Minister Joyner and his brother, Rev. Richard Joyner of Conetoe, and others will be assisting in this effort through the plowing of the field, bringing in horse manure and supplying the plants for our first planting (among other things) free of charge. As we joyfully anticipate the completion of our new Multi-Purpose Center and landscaping, the initial work in the garden will not start until sometime thereafter. With this in mind, the volunteers look forward to planting a fall garden of collards, cabbages, broccoli and winter cucumbers to share from their first harvest with the Springfield Family.

If you are interested in being a dedicated gardening volunteer, who isn't afraid of getting their hands dirty, doing a little hard work and have the time to donate, the group wants and needs you to join them in this rewarding experience.
