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## Lesson #2

During our discussion of the Fruit of the Spirit, we will examine Paul's initial listing in Galatians. The written account of Galatians corresponds with Acts 13 & 14. After Paul and Barnabas leave, the \_\_\_\_\_ began to stir up trouble.

The Judaizers had two problems with Paul:

Examine: Galatians 5:13–26
