# IS IT NEW OR NOT?

### Please enjoy this BLESSED, GRACE FILLED, CHRIST-CENTERED CHRISTMAS, and let the JOY of CHRIST fill your heart!!!

The theme of this publication, "Jesus makes all things new," is based on II Corinthians 5:17. That passage states, "Therefore, if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold all things are become new." However, in Ecclesiastes 1:9 we read, "The thing that hath been, it is that which shall be; and that which is done is that which shall be done; and there is no new thing under the sun." Yet, in Revelation 21:5, we are told, "And he that sat upon the throne said, Behold I make all things new." These two concepts expressed in these several passages of sacred scripture appear to contradict each other. However, it only appears that way. They are not contradictory at all.

When the writer of Ecclesiastes speaks of "no new thing under the sun," it is obvious that he means that nothing can be created that has not already been created. Things may be reconstructed, but they will become only a rearrangement of what God has already made. It will not be a new thing. It will have only been given a new appearance.

On the other hand, when Jesus says, "Behold I make all things new," or when the Apostle Paul says, "Old things are passed away, and behold all things are become new," they both speak not of creating new things but of converting old souls into new souls. They do not imply the making of something that has never been, (God made us that way in the beginning, before "the fall"), but they simply suggest the restoration and renewal of something that already is.

This means at least two things. Firstly, it means that the old creature has become a new being. Secondly, it means that life takes on a new perspective by the new being and the new being takes on new ways of relating to the new perspective of life. In other words, once saved by Christ, the creature takes on new ways and the things the new creature encounters take on new meanings.

As a result of this, don't consider Christmas this year in the same old way that the world has always considered it. Rather, see it in the manner in which it was rightfully intended to be seen. See it in the way that Christ was born to cause us to see it – not as a time of empty frivolity and meaningless festivities, but as a time of real rejoicing and genuine thanksgiving for the coming of Christ. His coming condemns all the old that is stained with sin and creates the new that is sanctified and made sacred by his coming.

Before Christ came the world was filled with sin and without hope. Since He came, the world is still filled with sin. The difference, though, is that now the world has hope. Jesus came and He brought that hope with Him. That is what Christmas is all about, because it is all about Christ and that is what Christ is all about – salvation, hope, love, joy, and peace. Therefore, may the love of Christ fill your hearts. May the Spirit of Christ fill your minds. May the Will of Christ direct your way. May the peace of Christ attend your path. May the glory of Christ surround your life.

This ministry is not one that members can join, volunteer, or be assigned to as other ministries. We are here to support the church and the ladies of the church. We are active participants in SBC's Ministers and Deacons Family Ministry. We visit the sick with our husbands and also as a group. We meet the Wednesday before the first Sunday of each month or as needed.

We are responsible for the preparation of the communion linen and dressing the communion table. The Ministers and Deacons Wives in past years were responsible for assisting the Pastor, making sure items needed for baptism were in place and taken to the cleaners after baptism. We were also responsible for cleaning the gloves that are worn by the Pastor, Deacons and Ministers.

As a Ministry, we host two annual outside events. Each October, we provide and serve hot meals to the families in the ICU/Critical Care Unit at WakeMed Hospital. We also minister and have prayer with the families and friends of the patients. In the spring of the year and for the Christmas holiday season, we put together nutritional snack bags and bottled water and deliver to WakeMed for the families in the ICU/Critical Care Unit. We report back to the church any prayer request or praise reports we receive. The holiday delivery is part of our Annual Holiday Fellowship where we get together (restaurant, Community Center, Wives' home) and have fun and fellowship, eating, gifting, and giving thanks!!!

For our "young ladies" of Springfield, and the community, we held an Etiquette Workshop. They were taught proper table etiquette, verbal communication skills, how to dress, and how to carry themselves as a Christian. We participated in the Empowerment Session here at Springfield, getting to learn about other ministries as well as telling others about ours.

It is our prayer that God is pleased with the service that we render and that He continues to bless and keep us as we journey on in Jesus name.

### Run/Walk with an Olympian




- Saturday, November 3, 2018: South Mountain Trail 5kRun/Walk in Bostic, NC to benefit kids attending summer camp at South Mountain Christian Camp. The aim of the camp is to utilize the Bible-centered ministry to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ. Through well-planned programming, teaching, sharing in fellowship and healthy physical activities; the hope is to help camp-ers respond in faith to the call of God on their lives and then nurture their faith and fellowship in Christ Jesus so that they may mature into responsible citizens of God's Kingdom.
- Saturday, November 10, 2018: Globalrun4water 5k Run Walk at WakeMed Soccer Park in Cary, NC. The mission is to help needy people in the world have clean drinking water because safe water helps to liberate people so they can live healthier, fuller, and more productive lives.

Over the 6 years of this race, we have raised over \$61,000. Using these pro-ceeds in combination with matching funds from District 7710 and The Rotary Foundation, we have been able to provide clean water, hygiene training, and in some cases modern sanitation facilities to villages and schools in Bolivia, the Dominican Republic, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, India, Lebanon, Peru, Tanzania, and Uganda.

Clean water, hygiene training, and adequate sanitation facilities are much needed components for disease prevention, good health, and quality of life that the residents of these communities lacked due to their extreme poverty.


